

IS IT REGISTERED COMMON LAND?

If you see new works going up on open access moorland and want to find out if it is common land and has the necessary consent then this should help.



November 2008. Start of new fencing on Carnyorth Common before it became re-registered as common land in October 2013.

CC Commons and Greens tell me that members of the public can make an appointment to view maps of common land free of charge at their offices in Truro. They have a long-term project to publish maps of common land on line however priority is being given to current casework. Enter name you require under MAP SEARCH

Go to 'Table of Contents' ACCESS

Click on REGISTERED COMMON LAND (common land areas will appear in green)

To make a site check to show the name and common land number for identification purposes of the chosen area go to FEATURE TOOLS at centre top of page and click on the middle icon (Site Check) and follow instructions.

BUT NOTE: the 'Magic Map' is far from being up-to-date and still does not show any of the common land re-registered since 2013 through successful SPM applications. For these areas please go to our web site at
